The reputational risk to businesses directly or indirectly associated with instances of human trafficking and worker exploitation is real.

The conference will provide practical advice when the demand for low skilled workers leaves businesses vulnerable to employing within their supply chain - unknowingly - individuals trafficked for labour exploitation. Case studies from the hospitality and catering sector will also be included.
